the October JMLA and I am very pleased.
I was pleased to find this issue devoted
to the British Journal of Medical Genetics,
published by Elsevier. It has been an

important platform and much of the success of the JMLA in terms of authorship and usage is owed to it. For the first time, this edition of the JMLA has included a cross-reference table that lists the articles that have used each gene name in the text. This is very useful as I find, from time to time, that I am unable to trace references to articles that I have already read. I use references in this way for guidance, and sometimes, when other articles have cited, say, a pre-selected set of articles, I am able to use that list as a means of checking that I have not missed any articles. It would also be interesting to see the impact of linking articles to the literature, although this is not yet happening. The front page tells me that this volume contains papers on

the following species: *Arabidopsis, C. elegans, Drosophila, H. sapiens, O. sativa, P. tigris* and *T. rubripes*. I am not familiar with these species and so I decided to look at the index and discover which are the most common. To do this, I opened the index of the JMLA and typed '*Arabidopsis*' or '*C. elegans*' into the 'search for word(s)' box. The results that appeared were impressive. There are 267,001 references that contain '*Arabidopsis*' and another 50,764 for '*C. elegans*'. This means that, currently, there are over 270,000 references in the JMLA that contain either *Arabidopsis* or *C. elegans*. If we could count the references that contain both, then this would rise to over 40,000, which is a substantial proportion of the total. If we

add this figure to the total references for the other species, we find that there are more than 500,000 references that have used *Arabidopsis* or *C. elegans* in the JMLA alone. This is a substantial base of evidence c6a93da74d
